

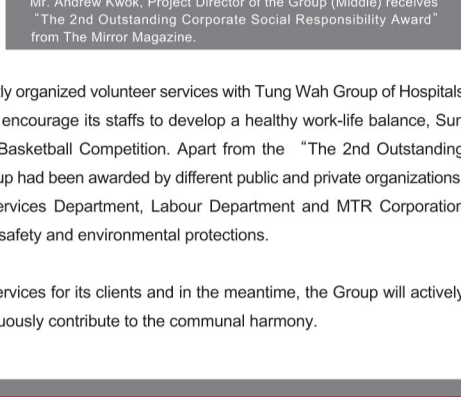
Sun Fook Kong Received "The 2nd Outstanding Corporate Social Responsibility Award"

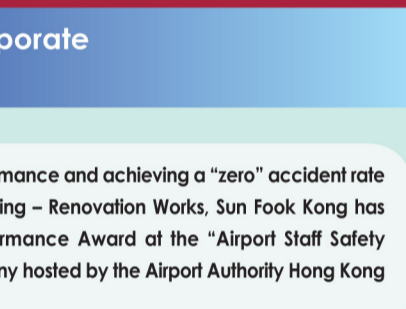
Mr. Shing Yu Cheung, the event organizer and the Senior Project Manager of the Group delivered an opening speech.

Winners of the game were awarded with the 65th anniversary octopus card.



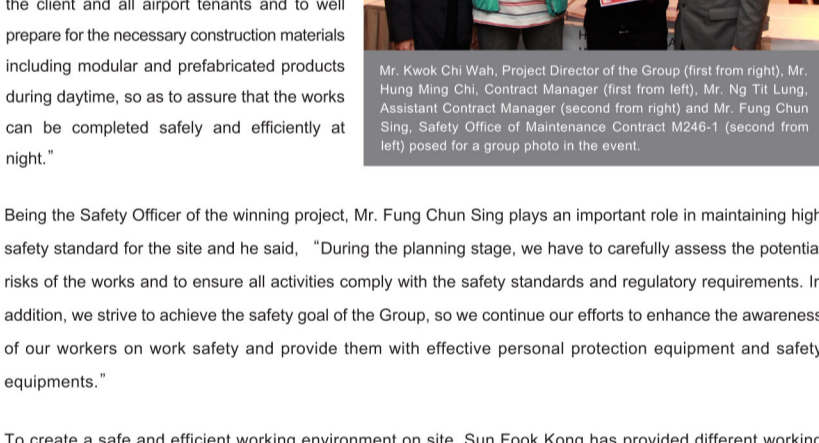

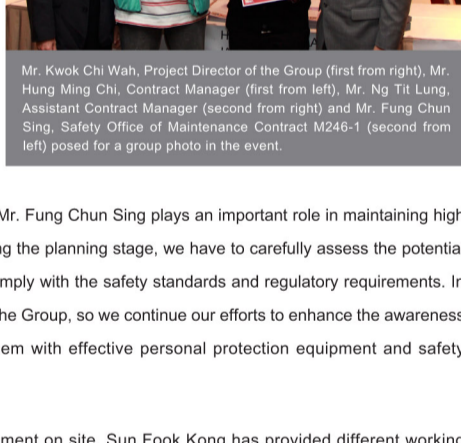
Sun Fook Kong wins the Corporate Safety Performance Award

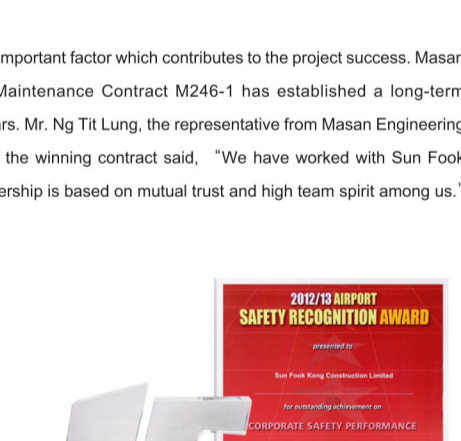
Mr. Kwok Chi Wah, Project Director of the Group (left) received the Corporate Safety Performance Award from The Airport Authority Hong Kong.

The Airport Authority Hong Kong organized the "Airport Staff Safety Recognition Scheme" aiming to foster a safety culture for the airport community and invited their senior management to assess all private and public organizations in the airport on their performances in occupational safety and health issues. And the "Corporate Safety Performance Award" is a new award for 2012/2013 to recognize the continuous efforts of its business partners in providing a safe working environment for staffs.

Facing a tight work schedule, our project team has to communicate well with the client and all airport tenants and to well prepare for the necessary construction materials including modular and prefabricated products during daytime, so as to assure that the works can be completed safely and efficiently at night."

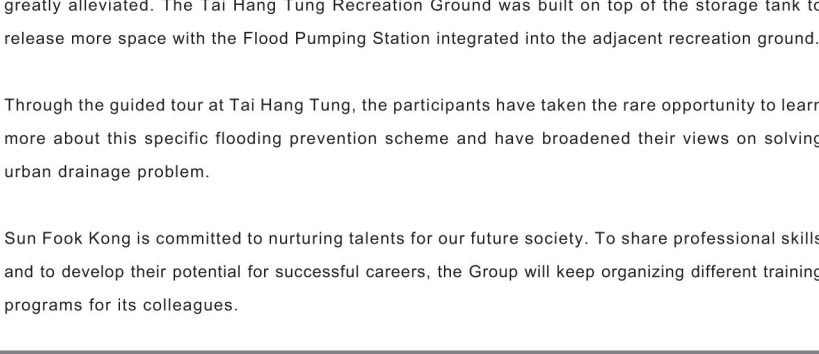

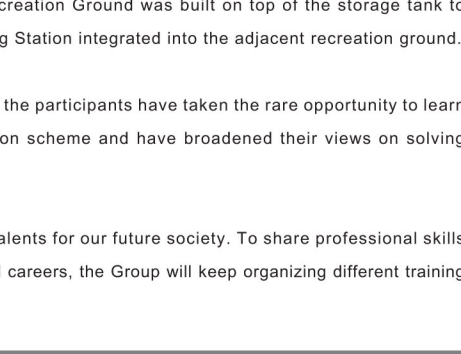
Sun Fook Kong Colleagues Actively Participated in the DSD Guided Tour at Tai Hang Tung Stormwater Storage Tank

Around 30 Sun Fook Kong Colleagues had joined the Drainage Services Department (DSD) guided tour at Tai Hang Tung Stormwater Storage Tank on 7 March 2013.

During the briefing, the DSD staff used a set of graphical display boards to explain the background, layout, construction sequence, operation, landscaping and structural design of the Tai Hang Tung Storage Scheme. After that, the participants were guided to tour the whole underground floodwater storage tank and the associated Flood Pumping Station.

The Tai Hang Tung Storage Scheme (THTSS) is the largest stormwater storage tank in Hong Kong with a capacity of 100,000m3. It is a drainage improvement scheme managed by DSD to reduce overflow and surface run-off discharged into the existing drainage system and to solve the flooding problems in West Kowloon, in particular, Mong Kok, Yau Ma Tei, Tai Kok Tsui, Sham Shui Po and Tai Hang Tung areas during heavy rain.

The Scheme is a complex and sophisticated stormwater detention scheme. Under normal conditions, the stormwater will flow into the existing drainage system in the downstream Mong Kok area without entering the storage tank. During heavy rainstorms, the stormwater will spill over the overflow weir into storage tank. When rainstorm subsides and the water level in the downstream drains recedes, the stored stormwater will be pumped back to the drainage system for discharge into the sea.

The flood storage tank provides temporary storage for surface runoff during heavy rainstorms, thereby reducing the burden on the downstream stormwater drainage system and subsequently the scheme minimizes the need for upgrading the drainage system. With the commissioning of this major flood prevention infrastructure in 2004, the flood protection level of West Kowloon has been significantly improved and the flooding problem at Mong Kok and Prince Edward areas has been greatly alleviated. The Tai Hang Tung Recreation Ground was built on top of the storage tank to release more space with the Flood Pumping Station integrated into the adjacent recreation ground.

Through the guided tour at Tai Hang Tung, the participants have taken the rare opportunity to learn more about this specific flooding prevention scheme and have broadened their views on solving urban drainage problem.
